

# cotton production in Brazil: a study in efficiency

Brazilian cotton production of the past decades is a case study in world-class efficiency. With a laser focus on innovation & improved practices Brazil has halved the amount of land dedicated to cotton production while at the same time growing production in 487%.

# Brazilian cotton: a tiny proportion of the country's land use



Because of these massive gains in efficiency and reduction in land use, cotton production in Brazil occupies only a tiny proportion of the country's total area.

Covering 2,1 m hectares, cotton production represents all of just 0.2% of total Brazilian land use.

Other crops and forestry occupy just over 9.1%, while 2/3rds of the country's land is preserved in native vegetation conservation areas.

## Brazilian cotton farming: a family affair



- 500 farmer families with business approach.
- 250+ gins.
- 6,500 ha average area.

- Crop rotation with soyabeans & corn and widespread regenerative agriculture practices.
- ▶ Innovation-focused with use of latest technologies, practices and developments.
- Preserves 20-35% of total farm property area as native vegetation.

We take a holistic approach to sustainability, focused on the environmental, social and economic impacts of our practices, to ensure a healthy sector growing for the future generations.

80% of Brazil's total cotton crop is ABR certified

100% of farm audits are conducted annually by independent 3<sup>rd</sup> parties









With our unique system of integrating gins within our cotton-producing farms, thanks to our bale ID tag system we are able to ensure full physical traceability of every bale of cotton from cultivation to the spinning mill.
